

VULNERABILITY TO CLIMATE CHANGE: CONSEQUENCES ON LABOUR AND THE ENVIRONMENT

Recommandations:

- Need for adoption and mitigation for more funds to be sourced in the formal channel to be enforced for the purpose of use.
- Establish dialogue with governments at national, sub-regional, regional and inter-regional levels.
- Trade Unions to push discussions on climate change at forums like AU as teachers don't take the issue seriously.
- Air pollution taxes to be imposed on investors, and the money realised to be used on rehabilitation.
- Cancellation of finance debts (Governments instead of looking into issues affecting their people for instance vulnerability to climate change or poverty alleviation, they are concentrated on exporting food and resources for debt serving).
- Need for national legislation as well as international standards for investors on environment.
- Need to have trade unions focal points at national, sub-regional, regional and inter-regional levels.
- Inter-boundary agreements to be put in place, especially those countries that shares lakes and rivers.
- Lobby to policy makers to promote sustainable agriculture and tourism in respective countries.

Need to give proper attention to compensation to ecological damage to developing countries.
